



9. The west end of Victoria Place, showing the highway layout which puts smaller vernacular buildings such as the Kings Head at a disadvantage. The former Post Office building opposite makes the transition effortlessly into Queen Street.



10. This attractive group of vernacular listed cottages stands at the former dogleg in a main route into town, now the junction between Queen Street and Spring Road. The gables of these buildings are as prominent and important in visual terms as their front facades.



11. This building is prominent in views of Lower Green Gardens, particularly from Station Road. It is much altered, and is somewhat detached from its neighbours by its open frontages. The extent of patched tarmac in this view is also of significance.



12. While Station Road is a street of some historic interest as far as the plan of the town has developed, its constituent buildings are only of average quality and have been subject to considerable alteration. The loss of enclosure as Station Road extends towards Lower Park Road also puts it at odds with other parts of the Area.
