



Interaction Partnership Action Plan -1/4/06 to 31/3/10

Introduction

This plan sets out a delivery framework for multi-agency working across the Partnership's **thematic objectives**. The plan seeks to capture both improvements instigated and supported by the Safer, Stronger Communities Fund since it was established in 2006, as well as services and activities already being provided (or are under consideration for provision in the future) in the two wards. All of the organisations listed below are currently providing a service(s) which will in some way contribute to the overall attainment of the objectives set out below. The precise nature and method of assessing their contribution has been highlighted in the milestones and measures column. Certain services and initiatives or activities will potentially bring multiple, cross theme, benefits and therefore will address a number of objectives.

In Appendix, a list has been compiled to show the organisations that are directly contributing to the attainment of **thematic targets** set in the Interaction Partnership Strategy and who will be the source of the key performance information data to measure the overall impact of the Partnership.
