

21. In contrast to the foregoing caption, rear yards of High Street properties in Thomas Street lack consistency and could be visually improved.



22. This attractive house dating from the second quarter of the 19th century is a significant feature at the foot of New Street where it meets Waterside and Colne Road. The small forecourt has been surfaced with unit paving, but the pedestrian barrier is insufficiently substantial in this context.



23. Recent housing developments have transformed Hall Cut but the carriageway itself is bland and uninteresting. With greater consideration also given to the storage requirements of the supermarket on the main road frontage, the comprehensive consideration of Hall Cut would be an enhancement of the Area as a whole.



24. This house on Richard Avenue is on the edge of the Area and does not have a strong relationship with any other buildings or spaces of historic interest. Along with the church centre and the vicarage, it is recommended for exclusion from the Area.
