



17. The rear yard of The Galleon forms an attractive group with the Board of Trade wreck warehouse at the foot of Sydney Street. The pantiled roof is an attractive feature, and always looks well with weatherboarding.



18. There is a strong contrast between the Jacobean styling of the former Anchor Hotel, and the nautically workmanlike façade of the Colne Yacht Club. Conversely, the flat-roofed character of the Boat Centre on Waterside is not appropriate given its street setting.



19. The Wreck House is an important survival, though its small forecourt could do with some visual improvement. Together with the adjacent boathouses it forms an important part of the enclosure of Waterside independent of the James and Stone yard to the south.



20. Buildings on the small triangular island with Copperas Road display a variety of facing materials though their maritime purpose remains clear. The simply detailed and relevantly consistent rear yards contain an interesting and colourful array of equipment.
