Online admissions

Parents and carers who live in Essex can now apply for their child's school place online using the Essex Online Admissions Service at:

www.essex.gov.uk/admissions

The online application system has a number of benefits for parents and carers:

- it's quick and easy to use;
- you can access related information through links on the website to find out more about individual schools, such as home to school transport or inspection reports;
- you can change the details on your application up to the closing date;
- you will immediately be sent an email confirmation that your application has been received;
- you will be told the outcome of your application more quickly than by post if you request it to be sent to you by email as well.

When making your online application use this space to record your unique identification code (UID). Please also make a note of the password you choose when first logging on to make your application as you will need it to enter the site on any future occasion.

You will be able to make your application online from **17 October 2011**.

The closing date for primary applications is **15 January 2012**. This is the statutory national closing date set by the government.

You will be able to view your application online after the closing date of 15 January but you will not be able to amend your preferences after this time. Should you have a genuine reason for amending your preferences after the closing date, you will need to notify School Planning and Admissions in writing (see page 10 of the *Primary Education in Essex 2012/2013* booklet).

Please note that it is not possible to apply for a junior school or a mid-year place on line.

Introduction to the Schools' Admissions Policies Directory for North-East Essex

Information about applying for primary schools was sent out in October 2011 to all known parents or carers of children who were born between 1 September 2007 and 31 August 2008 and were resident in Essex and registered with an Essex GP in May 2011. This Directory should be used with that information and the Primary Education in Essex 2012/2013 booklet which is available on our website at www.essex.gov.uk/admissions or on request (contact details on page 32) by parents and carers whose children will be starting primary education or transferring from infant to junior school in North-East Essex in the school year that begins in September 2012.

In this Directory you will find the School Admission policies of all the primary, infant and junior schools in the North-East Essex locality. You can also view them on our website by selecting the individual school and then the 2012/2013 admission policy. This includes areas 4 (Colchester) and 5 (Tendring) on the map below. On page 6 it explains what the different parts of these policies mean.

When you make your application for your child please do this online (details on page 2), on the form which you can download from our website or request (contact details on page 32). **Please do not do both.**

The deadline for receipt of forms is **15 January 2012**.

Note 1

This figure shows the total number of applications received for the last academic year, so gives you an idea of the demand for places at the school. Treat this information carefully and talk to the school about it. For instance, some applications may have been second or third preferences that increase the overall number of applications. However you must be aware that if you only apply for schools that are oversubscribed you may not receive a place at any of them. Each school has a capacity measurement to show the number of pupils that can be accommodated.

Note 2

Timing of Admission. As required by law with effect from September 2011, all infant and primary schools provide for the full-time admission of all children offered a place in the reception year group from the September following their fourth birthday. This means that you have the right to a full time place at the school your child is offered from September 2012. Research has shown that outcomes are better for reception children who start school in September.

The law does not require a child to start school until the start of the term following their fifth birthday. Compulsory school age is reached at that point. Parents can request that the date their child is admitted to school is deferred until later in the school year or until the child reaches compulsory school age in the school year. Where entry is deferred, the school will hold the place for that child and not offer it to another child. The parent would not however be able to defer entry beyond the beginning of the term after the child's fifth birthday, nor beyond the academic year for which the original application was accepted.

Parents can also request that their child attends part-time until the child reaches compulsory school age. You would need to check with the individual school(s) what the part-time provision would be.

Where parents choose to defer entry, the school may reasonably expect that the child would start at the beginning of a new school term/half term.

6. children with at least one parent who is regularly involved in the work and worship of another Christian Church in affiliation with Churches Together in England (with supporting SIF from the relevant minister);
7. children of parents, who, although worshipping in another faith, wish their child to attend a church school because of its specific religious emphasis (with supporting SIF from the relevant religious leader);

8. children for whom there is a special social, medical or pastoral reason for the child to attend the school (with supporting written evidence from a relevant professional involved with the child and a SIF indicating why it is essential for the child to attend);
